

# **Parts of Speech Poster or Cards**

## **COMMON NOUN**

Identifies a non-specific person, thing, place, or idea.

girl, bear, monster, country, mountain, river, city, book, fork, paper, pen, pear, love

## PROPER NOUN

Identifies a specific person, thing, place, or organization.

Jason, Connie, February, India, Africa, Paris, Mars, Amazon, Sony, Titanic

### **VERB**

Describes an action, state, or occurrence.

eat, run, fly, speak, dance go, write, read, make, think, become, love, have, believe

### **ADVERB**

A word that modifies or qualifies an adjective, verb, or other adverb.

clearly, quickly, happily, so really, gently, easily, lazily, badly, safely, successfully

## **ADJECTIVE**

A word that describes a noun or a pronoun.

nice, expensive, happy, old, tall, heavy, round, long, red, French, serious, beautiful

#### PREPOSITION

A word usually used before a noun or pronoun to show time, direction, place, or location.

above, in, on, at, to, across, beside, between, down, by, under, upon, within, off, from

#### CONJUNCTION

A word used to connect clauses or sentences, or to connect words in the same clause.

for, and, nor, but, or, yet, so as, whenever, who, which, that, although, since, until

#### **PRONOUN**

A word that replaces a noun in a sentence.

she, he, it, we, they, her, him its, our, their, hers, his, ours theirs, herself, ourselves
